LOGLINE

Inspired by a story of courage, a filmmaker and her legendary marathon mentor train and travel in secret to join the brave Afghan women who are standing up for equality and freedom, by running in the Marathon of Afghanistan.

SYNOPSIS

When the first Afghan woman stood up for her freedom and ran in the Marathon of Afghanistan, she started a movement for equality that spread around the world. Zainab's story inspired legendary marathon runner, Martin Parnell, to imagine what his life might be like if his gender prevented him from going outside to run. Martin vowed to run in the Marathon of Afghanistan the following year to support Zainab, and partnered with filmmaker and first time marathoner, Kate McKenzie, to tell the story. To avoid making the marathon a target for terrorist attack, they must train, and travel to Afghanistan in secret, where they will uncover unexpected beauty, incredible hardships, and the amazing people who stand for change. This is the story of the brave Afghan women who are risking it all for the freedom to run.

THE STORY BEHIND THE FILM

The reality of documentary filmmaking is that inevitably the story changes as you go. As you meet people, capture footage and hear stories you start to learn that perhaps what you set out to do, isn't where you will end up.

This reality was true for the making of *The Secret Marathon*, but we were also faced with making some drastic changes after we thought we knew what the story was.

After meeting incredible Afghan women, and capturing beautiful footage of a country that is not normally showcased as beautiful, we realized we had an amazing story to tell. After the first edit was complete, we sent it over to the women in the film. It was at this time that we learned that one of the women and her family had been receiving threats, simply because she ran in the marathon. Naturally, she asked to be removed from the film.

This was a tough thing to hear for many reasons. This brave woman had to be removed from the film because she was not safe to openly run. This became as important a story as the Afghan women who are finding the freedom to run. In the end, the safety of everyone involved in this project will always be our top priority.

We added a year in post production. Alongside a team of Afghan women advising us, we completely re-edited the film, adding an animation sequence that is woven throughout. While fictional, this piece represents the daily experiences of Afghan women.

It is our hope that with this film, we can share an uplifting story of change, while still bringing awareness to the reality that for many women in Afghanistan, they still do not feel free to run.

Her most recent project is the feature length documentary film *The Secret Marathon* which premiered at Cinéfest Sudbury to a sold our crowd, followed by the Edmonton International Film Festival, also to a sold out crowd, where it won the Audience Choice Award for best documentary. The film has also inspired The Secret 3K, an annual run/walk in multiple cities across Canada and around the world to promote gender equality and safe and inclusive spaces. Kate is also the Manager of ATB X a business accelerator



where Kate helps businesses achieve growth. As a published author, exhibiting fine artist and professional public speaker, Kate is passionate about sharing meaningful stories across a variety of mediums. Her TEDx talk about the Power of Positive News has had nearly 10,000 views. Kate has a Masters in Digital Media from Ryerson University and a Bachelors in Education with a specialization in experiential learning from the University of Lethbridge.

SCOTT TOWNEND CO-DIRECTOR, EXECUTIVE PRODUCER, EDITOR



We all have a story to tell. For Scott Townend, his just happens to be about telling stories. He may not have known it early on, but he's been a filmmaker his whole life. What started off with the family VHS camera and the magic of capturing a moment in time, eventually became a decision to go to film school, followed by a career working as a writer, director, producer and editor. He's worked on feature films, television, music videos and commercials, most recently completing the feature length documentary *The Secret Marathon*, which premiered at Cinefest Sudbury to a sold our crowd, followed by the Edmonton International Film Festival, also to a sold out crowd, where

it won the audince choice award for best documentary. Both screenings ended in with an overwhelming standing ovation. Scott has completed hundreds of productions over the past 15 years working as a professional filmmaker, and after all that time, he still feels that there is magic in telling a good story. For that reason, this is most likely just the beginning of his.

Martin Parnell EXECUTIVE PRODUCER

In 2010, following a 25-year mining career, Martin Parnell started his *Quests for Kids* initiative. Over the next five years he completed ten quests. These included running 250 marathons in one year, setting five Guinness World Records in endurance events and summiting Mount Kilimanjaro in 21 hours. At the end of 2014, he had raised over \$1.3 million dollars for the humanitarian organization Right To Play and 27,000 children had been given the gift of hope. Martin is a keynote speaker, workshop facilitator and author, His first book *Marathon Quest* was published by Rocky Mountain Books and CBC Radio listed him as one of Alberta's top five authors, for 2014. His second book, *Running To The Edge*, was released in November 2016. The final book of The Marathon Trilogy, *The Secret Marathon - Empowering women and girls in Afghanistan through sport* was published on October 30th 2018. Martin is also Executive Producer of *The Secret Marathon* documentary which had its World Premiere screening on September 22nd 2019 at the Cinefest Film Festival in Sudbury, Ontario to a sold out crowd, and a standing ovation.

Zainab

Zainab is an Ambassador for the charity Free to Run as well as the Program Officer for Skateistan. She is helping to promote women's participation in sport in her community and across Afghanistan. In 2015 she successfully completed a 250km self-supported footrace across the Gobi desert in China making history as part of Afghanistan's first ultra-marathon team. In 2015 Zainab also became the first woman to complete an official marathon in Afghanistan.



Murwarid Ziayee

Murwarid Ziayee is an advocate for women's rights and for girls' education in Afghanistan. She is the Senior Director for the charity, Canadian Women for Women in Afghanistan and is responsible for program management and support for public engagement outreach and fund development. She maintains strong connections between the country office in Kabul and the Canadian board, executive team and membership. Murwarid has a BA in Political Science and Law from Kabul University. She has worked in women's rights issues with different organizations including United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) and Office of the President of Afghanistan.



Hirra Farooqi

Hirra Farooqi is an aspiring documentary film-maker, recently graduated with her Bachelors in Journalism from Ryerson University. Hirra is a first generation immigrant of Afghan-Pakistani parents. Hirra hopes to produce her own documentaries focusing on marginalized communities within Central and South Asia in the near future.

There are many women who can not be named here, but we hope that through the film they feel that their voice is being heard.
